Extend Your Pool Season This Summer

More and more homeowners are choosing to heat their pools and spas with natural gas pool heaters. In New York and Pennsylvania, you can extend the swimming season and make the time spent in your pool or spa more enjoyable. You'll be able to use your pool or spa earlier in the year, keep it open later in the fall and have more days of fun all through the summer.

Pool and spa heaters are sized based on the surface area of the pool they will be heating. For example, if your pool is 15 feet by 20 feet, you'll need a pool heater that can handle 300 square feet of surface area. If you live in a windy area you may need a slightly larger pool heater. Your local pool dealer will be able to help you select the right size heater for your pool and/or spa.

Natural gas will cost you less – a lot less – than the other fuels to heat your pool each summer. For example, for a heated in-ground pool you could save up to \$500 per year by using natural gas instead of electric, and up to \$1,000 per year by using natural gas instead of propane.
